The Fiscal Year 2023-24 Funding Allocation Policy & Process (FAPP) outlines the proposed funding process and policies for distribution of Federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) and Home Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) funds for housing, economic development, public facilities and improvements, public services, and property rehabilitation activities that benefit low- and moderate-income households.

The percentages of available funds listed in the FAPP are shown as estimated projections. Percentages of available funds will be dedicated to eligible activities that are consistent with the priority needs that will be identified in the Orange County's FY 2020-24 Consolidated Plan (CP).

Substantial Amendment 2 to the FY 2021-22 Annual Action Plan is reallocating \$2,428,308 in Community Development Block Grant - Corona Virus funding for existing programs and small participating cities that previously were successful in spending their Community Development Block Grant - Corona Virus funding and to cities that implemented existing Housing Rehabilitation programs and permanent supportive and affordable housing programs; to the extent permanent supportive housing is not funded, allocating funding to cities that implemented Metropolitan City Community Development Block Grant Corona Virus programs, and regional homeless activities that support small and or metropolitan cities.

Consistent with 24 CFR 91.105, Housing & Community Development (HCD) encourages citizen participation by receiving comments throughout the year and more specifically providing Public Notices and Public Hearings regarding funding for housing and community development activities.

INVITATION TO BE HEARD:

Notice is hereby further given to provide the public a 30-day review period beginning **October 3, 2022 and ending November 3, 2022** to submit any concerns and/or comments. All persons either favoring or opposing the FAPP and or Substantial Amendment 2 the FY 2021-22 Annual Action Plan to Reallocation CDBG-CV funding, are invited to present their views in writing or before the Board of Supervisors.

Comments All interested agencies, groups, or individuals are invited to review the draft FAPP for FY 2023-24 and the Amendment 2 to the FY 2021-22 Annual Action Plan and submit written comments for consideration.
